New cell phone procedures for 2018-19 school year. Once the 7:40 a.m. bell has rung to go to class, students will go to their lockers, get their materials for first hour and leave their phones in their lockers. If a student has a phone in class, the teacher will take it away and bring it to the office where it will be kept for the remainder of the day.

If a student is walking down the hallway using their cellphone, it will be taken and brought to the office for the rest of the day.

Students may still take their cell phones to lunch and use them at this time and then return them to their lockers upon leaving the lunchroom.

If students need to call home or talk to a parent during the day, they will need to come to the office to do so.

We ask that parents realize your students will not have time or access to text or call until the lunch hour as there are only three minute passing periods from one class to the next. Should you need to get an emergency message to your child, please call the school and we will contact the student for you.

This is an effort to cut down on distractions throughout the day and increase the time and focus spent on educating all students.

As always, there are locks available for students to use on their lockers should they want to secure the lockers. Students simply need to ask in the office for a lock. If they wish to bring their own lock, they need to turn a key or the combination in to the office so that we may help them get into their locker should they have struggles with this (otherwise locks have to be cut off and ruined).
